After lots of rehearsing and practising, the children joined Reception for a wonderful Nativity performance, and what a moment it was! They all tried their very best as they headed up onto the stage. We are incredibly proud of every single one of them.

Alongside our Nativity preparations, we've been exploring all things Christmas in Nursery. The children have been learning about waiting, hope, and excitement during Advent, and we've shared plenty of festive stories and chats about this special time of year. We've also had great fun making sparkling decorations, colourful cards, and all sorts of Christmas crafts that have filled our space with creativity and cheer.

Another highlight has been enjoying a special Christmas dinner together. There were smiles all around as the children tucked into their festive food, chatted with friends, and soaked up the joyful atmosphere. The excitement was absolutely everywhere!

Reception

What a wonderful and busy few weeks we have had in Reception Class as we prepare for the Christmas season! The children have been full of excitement, energy, and joy as we worked together on a range of festive activities.

Our classroom has been buzzing as we rehearsed for our Nativity performance. The children have worked very hard learning their songs and lines, and we are so proud of their enthusiasm and confidence. A huge thank you to all parents for providing such lovely costumes—your support made the performance truly special. We're sure you'll agree that every child was wonderful on stage.

Throughout Advent, we have been talking about our journey to Christmas and thinking about how we can get our hearts ready for Jesus' birthday. The children have been doing good deeds around the classroom and being especially kind to their friends. It has been lovely to see their thoughtful actions and the pride they take in helping others.

In Drawing Club, we explored The Christmas Pine by Julia Donaldson. The children were captivated by the story and enjoyed discussing where their own "happy place" might be if they could take their Christmas tree anywhere in the world. Their ideas were imaginative, heartwarming, and beautifully expressed through their drawings.

In Maths, we have been focusing on counting and thinking carefully about what we need to remember to count accurately. The children have been practising pointing to each object in turn, saying the numbers in the correct order, and understanding that the final number they say tells them how many there are altogether.

As we come to the end of our first term together, we want to say how incredibly proud we are of how well the children have settled into school life. They have embraced new routines, formed lovely friendships, and shown great enthusiasm in their learning. It has been a joy to watch their confidence grow, and we are amazed at the progress they have already made.





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Year 1



Year One have been very busy recently. In Science, we have been learning all about the seasons with a particular focus on Winter. The children have been observing signs of Winter in our environment, such as frost, bare trees, and the colder weather. They have also been keeping a weather diary and have been checking the weather in both the morning and afternoon. Using symbols and labels, they recorded their observations to develop their understanding of Winter weather and how it changes throughout the day. In History, we have been exploring how toys have changed over time. The children started by looking at their own modern toys and comparing them with toys they played with as babies. Year One then learned about the toys their grown-ups played with when they were little. The children loved sharing their 'Ask Your Caregiver' sheets and talking about the toys their adults enjoyed.

We also explored toys that older relatives, such as grandparents, might have played with, discussing the similarities and differences between toys from the past and toys today. Year One have shown great curiosity and enthusiasm across all subjects and we are very proud of their hard work. In RE, the children have been busy creating Christmas cards for lonely and vulnerable members of our community. These cards will be delivered to a local care home, offering joy, companionship, and a reminder that they are loved and remembered at this special time of year. This project reflects key principles of Catholic Social Teaching, particularly the call to community, solidarity, and showing love to all. The children showed great enthusiasm and kindness and they truly enjoyed taking part in this meaningful act of service.



Year 2

We are so proud of Year 2 for performing so beautifully in their Nativity! The children loved having an audience and I hope you agree that the songs and the energy from the children were particularly special this year. In English, we have finished writing recount letters linked to Little Red and have now moved on to exploring the features of a poster through the Big Bad Wolf using adjectives to describe the big, bad wolf in detail.

In maths, we have just finished our shape unit and learned all about vertices, edges and faces and we are now recapping all of our learning from across the term and looking again at what a half and quarter are and thinking about the links to doubling and dividing into 2 or 4 equal groups. We have also been looking again at addition and subtraction and how partitioning our numbers, using our knowledge of number bonds can help us with this.

Last week in science, we investigated what the best material would be to keep the Three Little Pigs safe. This week, we had lots of fun exploring what material would make the best padding for Humpty Dumpty's fall- and then tested them out!

We continue to focus on Advent in RE, reflecting on what we can do to prepare for Christmas. Whilst in Art, we have been learning about and investigating monochromatic patterns and begun practising a range of techniques to create our own.





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Year 3



Year 3 have had another wonderful and productive few weeks, filled with creativity, hard work, and moments that have made us incredibly proud.

In English, the children have been developing their story-writing skills by creating imaginative narratives about a special object that transports the characters back in time. They have loved choosing whether their stories lead to the Stone Age or the Iron Age, and they are working hard to include rich description, and exciting action.

In Maths, we have been focusing on multiplication and division, particularly using the 2, 4, and 8 times tables. The children are becoming much more confident in spotting patterns, making links between facts, and explaining their strategies clearly.

Our Design Technology unit has been a hands-on highlight as we continue sewing Stone Age-style pouches. The children have shown fantastic perseverance and concentration, learning new stitching techniques and working carefully to produce thoughtful, well-designed pieces.

In RE, we have entered the season of Advent, focusing especially on Mary—her journey, her courage, and the qualities that make her a model of faith. The children have reflected sensitively on themes of hope, patience, and preparation.

A very special highlight has been our wonderful Nativity, which Year 3 shared with the whole school and with parents. The children's hard work, dedication, and enthusiasm truly shone through. Their performances were incredible, with loud, clear voices, beautiful singing, and confident acting. We are so proud of every single child for the effort they put in and the joy they brought to the performance. It was a moment to remember!





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Year 4

We've had a very busy few weeks in Year 4!

In Geography, the children have been learning all about our region and Campania, Italy. They've discovered fascinating facts about tectonic plates, earthquakes, and volcanoes — including the famous Mount Vesuvius!

In D.T., we've delved into our Fairtrade topic, exploring how ingredients are sourced and used to create delicious products. The children especially enjoyed becoming researchers as they used their senses to explore different types of chocolate before making their very own chocolate bark!

In Writing, we've been developing our diary entry skills, taking inspiration from Charlie and the Chocolate Factory. The children are now working hard on improving their setting writing skills to plan and write a setting description.



In R.E. we've completed our Catholic Social Teaching unit and have now moved on to Advent. It's been wonderful to see the children make thoughtful connections between the teachings and their understanding of the qualities of God's people and the qualities of saints. They've shown great insight in applying Catholic Social Teaching to their daily lives and living out God's word in their daily lives. We welcomed the beautiful mosaic of St Margaret Clitherow that Mr. Raine gifted the school. Additionally, children reflected deeper on the Advent candles of: Hope, Peace, Joy and Love, and Christ's candle lit on Christmas Day. Equally, they've thought about how they can prepare their hearts for the coming of Christ.

The children have worked so hard this term and are ready for a well-earned rest! Finally, they thoroughly enjoyed a delicious Christmas lunch made by our lovely cooks, and shared joy in appreciating their peers different Christmas jumpers! Thank you to all our parents and carers for your continued support. We wish you a peaceful and blessed Christmas! Huge well done to Year 4!!!





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Year 5



The children have recently completed their recount letters in English and are now diving into descriptive writing inspired by our class novel, *The Nowhere Emporium*. Their imaginations have taken them into magical, mysterious worlds, and they are working carefully with powerful verbs and figurative language to build atmosphere and bring their writing to life.

We have now completed our DT textiles unit, and we hope you were just as amazed as we were by the children's beautiful wall hangings. Their perseverance, creativity, and pride in their work truly shone through. Even those who doubted their sewing abilities at first have now mastered the running stitch, blanket stitch, and layered appliqué!

In RE, we have been reflecting on how we can "prepare the way" during Advent as we await the birth of Jesus. The children have been thinking deeply about the obstacles or barriers in their own lives that they can work to remove in order to become kinder, more compassionate, and more faithful followers of Christ.

As we prepare for the Christmas break, myself and Mrs. Tomlin would like to wish you all a blessed and joyful Christmas. Thank you for your continued support throughout the term, we look forward to seeing you all in the New Year!

We have already reached the final week of the term before Christmas, and it truly has flown by! This Advent, we are proud to be supporting the incredible charity TYAC (Teenage and Young Adult Cancer Service). On Tuesday 2nd December, Mr. Raine led a beautiful assembly sharing the inspiring work TYAC does to support families of young people facing a cancer diagnosis in our local area. He spoke movingly about how he and his family tirelessly fundraise in loving memory of their daughter, Natasha. The children were invited to wear something purple, the colour of TYAC and Natasha's favourite. It was heartwarming to see our school community come together so thoughtfully to honour such a meaningful cause.

This week, we also said a very emotional farewell to Mr. Raine. As a final gift to the school, he presented us with a stunning handmade mosaic of St Margaret Clitherow, thoughtfully placing each tile by hand. We are so grateful for his kindness, creativity and service, he will be dearly missed by us all.

In Maths, the children are certainly "fractions-ed out" after all their hard work this term! They have shown fantastic dedication while adding and subtracting mixed numbers, and we are incredibly proud of how confidently they now apply these tricky skills.





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Year 6

In English we have finished writing our non-Chronological reports. We have begun to look at the features of a letter and are practising lots of new writing skills to use in the letter. The letter will be based on the fictional letter from Terry Orange meets Opal Fruit – this is about a lost property operative who encounters a lost girl. This will enable us to identify the audience and purpose of a letter, select the appropriate style of writing, and use other similar writing as models for our own. We are also reading the Ladybird Classic 'Dracula' to inspire our work.

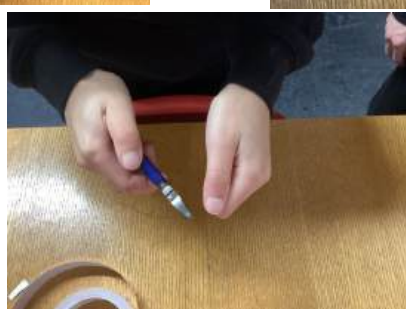
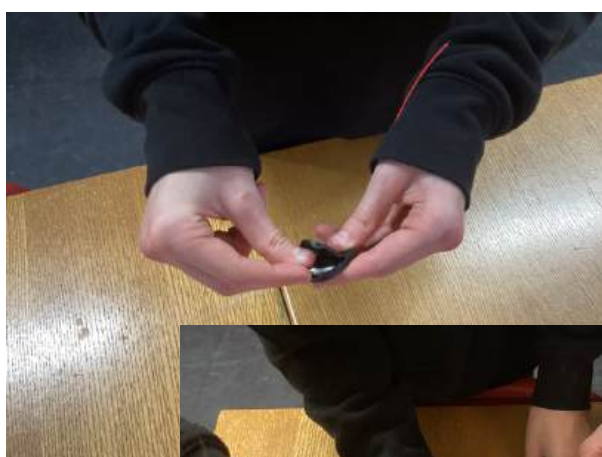
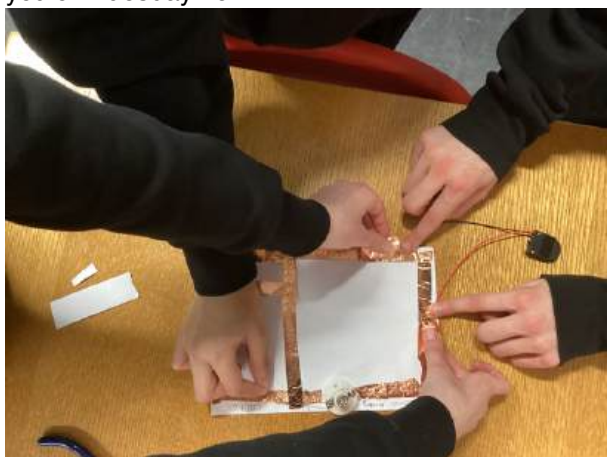
In Maths we have continued to work on fractions and over the last couple of weeks have worked hard on adding and subtracting fractions and mixed numbers, multiplying and dividing fractions by an integer and by other fractions and recorded our calculations using formal written methods, bar models and the grid system.

Our focus in RE is the preparation during Advent for the second coming of Christ. We have developed a deeper understanding of why Christians believe in the second coming, why we need Jesus to come again and how we can truly prepare our hearts and minds for when he arrives. We have looked at several parables including the Parable of the Bridesmaids and the Parable of the Servants to help us to unpick what it means to be ready. We then related this to our lives today by writing our own modern day version of a parable.

In computing we have been learning all about Binary systems. Binary is also known as Base 2 and uses only the digits 0 and 1. All inputs into computers are turned into Binary code and the 1 and 0 represent on and off. The on and off tells the computer what to do. When trying to work out a number in Base 10 or Denary using Binary you divide the number e.g. 59 by 2 and the remainder becomes the Binary number. You keep dividing till you have nothing left. When writing a Binary number, you start from the right. 59 therefore is 111011.

In Science and DT, we are continuing our work on circuits. This week we made circuits with copper tape and wire. These circuits will form the scary elements of our Gothic Structures which we will build in DT next week.

Year 6, together with Years 3 and 4, have been busy over the last month preparing for the Carol Service. We have practised many favourite Carols. We have enjoyed working with Mr Cannon to learn a new one this year and look forward to sharing it with you on Tuesday 16th.





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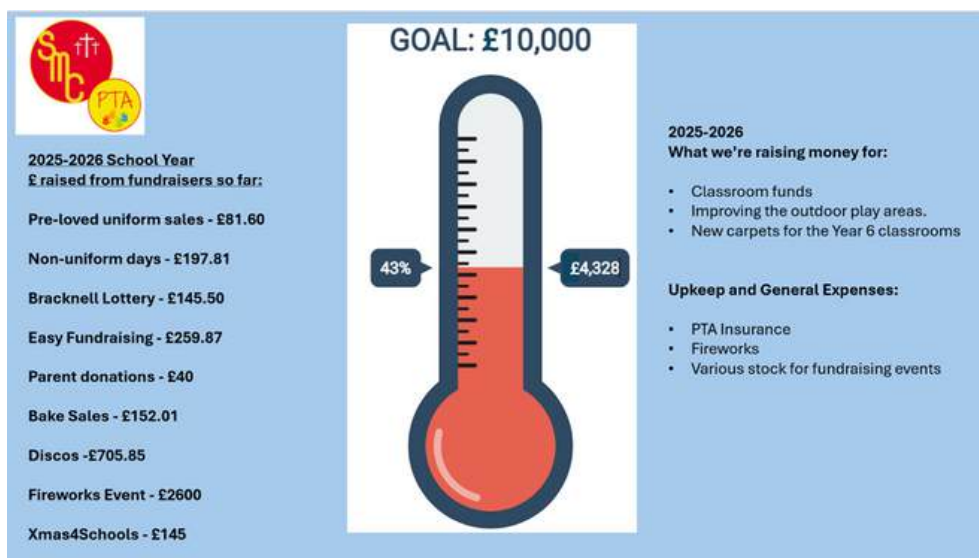

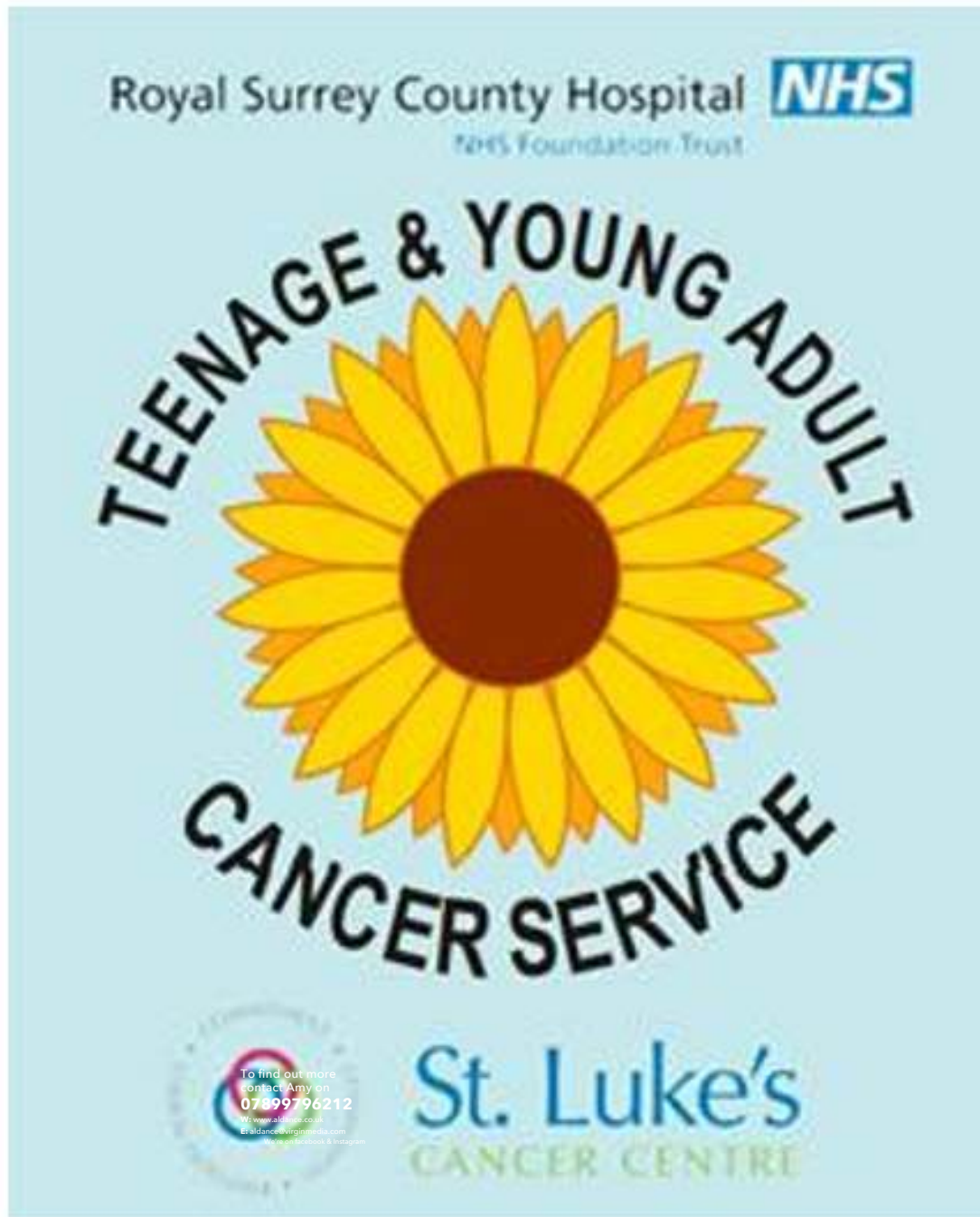
