The children travelled by coach and were very excited for the adventure ahead. Once we arrived, we explored the farm and met lots of different animals. The children enjoyed seeing and gently touching some of the animals, learning more about how to care for them.

One of the highlights of the day was the mini train ride. Along the way, the children spotted letters, discovered magical fairy houses hidden in the trees, and even saw some little diggers at work! Everyone was very observant and excited to point out what they could see.

We all enjoyed a picnic lunch together before continuing our adventure through the enchanted forest, where the children loved exploring the natural surroundings and using their imaginations.



The excitement continued in Dinosaur World, where we walked amongst the dinosaurs and listened carefully as we heard them roaring! There were lots of smiles and excited conversations as the children explored.

The children also had great fun playing on the slides and rope bridges, developing their confidence, balance, and teamwork skills. Throughout the day, the children walked incredibly well, helped each other around the park, and showed wonderful manners and kindness.

It was a busy day full of learning, exploration, laughter, and fun — and we are very proud of all the children for being such brilliant representatives of our school!



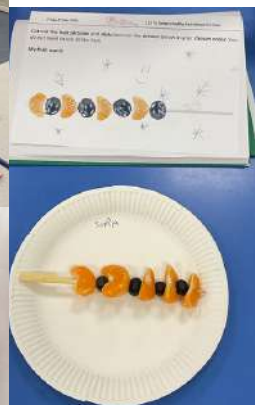
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Year 1

Year 1 have been busy with activities related to the story of Jack and the Beanstalk. In English we have been writing the story of Jack and the Beanstalk. In maths we have been sharing amounts of beans into halves and quarters. We have designed and made our own fruit kebabs for Jack as a healthy snack and have even planted our own beans! We are loving watching them grow and grow!



Year 2

The Year 2 children presented a beautiful and heartfelt Celebration of the Word, showing excellent teamwork, confidence, and respect throughout. They read the Gospel and their reflections with clear voices and great expression, helping everyone to understand the important message about trusting Jesus and following his example. The children demonstrated thoughtfulness as they explained how we can show kindness, love, and care to others in our daily lives. Their acting, actions, and footpaths helped bring the Gospel to life, while their prayers and singing created a peaceful and reflective atmosphere. All of the children participated wonderfully and represented Year 2 with pride, joy, and reverence.

In science, we continue to focus on 'Animals including Humans'. This week, the children learned about the importance of exercise and how our hearts work harder and beat faster when we exercise to pump blood to our muscles. We measured our heart rates after completing a series of different exercises to discover which activities make our bodies work the hardest. The children discovered that their heart rates were the highest after running, so that was the exercise that made us work the hardest.



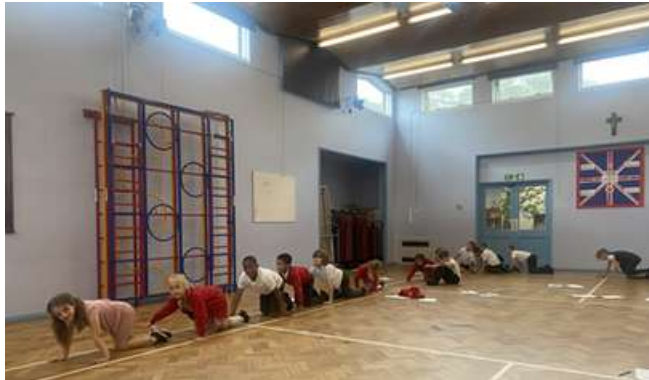


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Year 2 (Continued)



We have thoroughly enjoyed learning about the narrative Mighty Marrow in English. They have shown great enthusiasm when exploring the characters, settings and events within the story, and have worked hard to include key narrative features in their own work. They look forward to creating their own exciting narratives inspired by Mighty Marrow.



In art, we've been "going dotty"! Inspired by artist Yayoi Kusama, Year 2 has been busy mastering dots of all sizes using various painting and drawing techniques. This is all in preparation for our upcoming in-class art installation, where we will transform part of our classroom into a world of spots.

In Geography our mini-meteorologists have been braving the elements! After learning how weather works, the children built their own weather vanes. Next week, we'll be heading to the school weather station daily to monitor the rainfall, temperature, wind direction and cloud cover and make general weather observations for our week-long weather study.





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Year 3



Year 3 have continued to work incredibly hard over the past few weeks and have shown great enthusiasm across all areas of their learning.

In RE, the children shared thoughtful ideas and reflections during our learning about Eastertide. We have now moved on to explore the events of Pentecost, discussing the importance of this special event and what it meant for the disciples. The children have contributed some very mature and insightful responses during discussions.

In English, we have been exploring biographies and learning about the key features of this style of writing. The children are now planning their own biographies based on a fairy tale villain, which has inspired some wonderfully imaginative ideas. Cruel deeds, dangerous poisons, magical powers, and dramatic adventures have filled the classroom, leading to some fantastic descriptive writing and creative character development.

In Maths, we are continuing our work on time, including reading clocks, understanding durations, and solving time problems. Please continue to practise telling the time at home, as this extra support really helps to build confidence in class.

Our DT learning linked to our previous plants topic in Science where we created so wonderful summer rolls. We tried new flavours and textures as well as learning kitchen safety rules.

In French, we have been learning how to talk about things we can and cannot do, practising new vocabulary and sentence structures with growing confidence.

In Science, we have been discovering the topic of light, learning about how we see, how light travels, and the importance of staying safe in the sun. The children have particularly enjoyed taking part in exciting practical experiments and investigations to deepen their understanding of the topic.

It has been another fantastic few weeks in Year 3, and we are incredibly proud of the creativity, curiosity, and effort the children continue to show every day!





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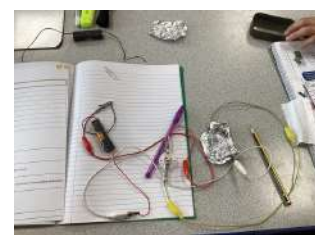
Year 4

Year 4 have continued to show a positive attitude towards their learning and have enjoyed a lively and engaging half term across the curriculum.

In Maths, the children have been developing their understanding of shape, angles, symmetry and polygons. As we approach the Multiplication Tables Check, the children are working incredibly hard to further strengthen their times table fluency through regular practice and recall activities.

In English, the children have been writing a narrative inspired by Escape from Pompeii. They have focused on using direct speech effectively to convey characters' thoughts, feelings and emotions within their writing.

Science lessons have been full of hands-on learning as the children explored electrical circuits. They demonstrated excellent problem-solving skills when investigating why circuits may not work and developed their understanding of electrical safety, including conductors and insulators.



In D.T., the children designed and created their own Roman chariots, carefully testing and improving their designs to ensure the wheels and axles were stable and strong. They thoroughly enjoyed combining their Science and D.T. knowledge by testing whether the class model would move when connected to a motor and electrical circuit.

In P.E., the children have been practising a variety of skills and techniques in preparation for Sports Day. Their teamwork, determination and enthusiasm have been wonderful to see.

Year 4 also led our class Celebration of the Word beautifully. Jesus' light truly shone through the children as they reminded us that, during the season of Eastertide, Jesus revealed Himself to the disciples. They reflected thoughtfully on how Jesus is present within all of us if we take the time to look closely.

In R.E., we concluded our Easter topic by reflecting on Jesus as the Light of the World. They enjoyed illustrating the Ascension of Jesus and were very proud of their work. The children explored Jesus' new commandment: "Love one another as I have loved you." They discussed how we can live out God's word through kindness, peace, forgiveness and love in our everyday lives.

I am incredibly proud of all the children in Year 4 for their continued effort, enthusiasm and positive attitude towards learning. Keep up the fantastic work!



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Year 5



Year 5 have continued to work incredibly hard this term and have enjoyed some fantastic learning opportunities along the way. One of the definite highlights of recent weeks was our exciting trip to Winchester Science Centre. The children had a wonderful day immersed in hands-on scientific experiences and discoveries that brought many of their classroom topics to life.

The planetarium was certainly a favourite part of the visit. The children were completely captivated as they immersed themselves in the fascinating world of space, stars, and the wider universe. Looking up at the projected night sky and learning more about stars and planets allowed the children to feel as though they had stepped into space themselves. It sparked so much curiosity and excitement, with many children leaving full of questions and wonder about our universe.

During one of the workshops, the children explored solids, liquids, and gases in a practical and engaging way. They even had the opportunity to make slime while investigating how materials can change and behave differently. The workshop encouraged the children to think scientifically and apply their understanding of particles. The children themselves became "particles," acting out how solids stay tightly packed together while gases spread further apart and move freely. This interactive approach made scientific concepts much easier to understand and, most importantly, lots of fun!

The day also included exploring simple mechanisms such as pulleys and levers, linking brilliantly to our previous DT learning. The children enjoyed discovering how these mechanisms help us move and lift objects more easily. They were also given time to freely explore the interactive exhibits around the science centre. There were opportunities to investigate how sound travels through vibrations and waves, experiment with hands-on investigations, and even try on an astronaut outfit! It was wonderful to see the children so engaged and excited to learn through exploration and discovery. The trip truly was a fantastic day of immersive learning that created many memorable experiences.

Back in the classroom, Year 5 have moved on to position and direction, where the children have explored coordinates and translation of shapes. In Geography, the children have been learning about the different environments around the world and considering how living things adapt to survive within them. The children investigated plants, trees, and animals living in our local area and considered how our school grounds form part of a wider ecosystem. We also looked at local Ordnance Survey maps and practised reading keys and symbols to locate features and develop important geographical fieldwork skills.

Overall, the children have worked exceptionally hard and continue to make us proud every day with their enthusiasm and determination. The children should feel incredibly proud of all they have achieved so far.





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Year 6

What an incredibly busy month Year 6 have had, the children have been extremely focused on their learning in preparation for SATs - which have now finished - and on practising their skills of editing and improving their writing.

In English our focus has been on writing a set of instructions using adverbials of manner, place and time; expanded noun phrases with parentheses. The class then had the option of writing a set of instructions for a witch or choosing their own subject matter to write instructions.

In Maths, we completed the Year 6 curriculum by working on Statistics and Shape. Within these units, the children have learnt how to find the internal angles of a range of polygons, how to find missing angles and how to interpret data.

In RE we have debated whether it is okay to doubt and what the story of Doubting Thomas teaches us about faith and Jesus.

Finally, this week we have looked at Eternal Life, images of Heaven and the meaning behind the symbols included in the Catholic Funeral Rite.



This term, Year 6 is exploring the powerful connection between creativity and conservation. We've been asking a big question: Can art help save the environment? To put our ethics into practice, we have been learning why watercolour paints are an eco-friendlier choice than acrylics, which are essentially liquid plastic. Our young activists have already been busy making protest collages, using mixed media to find a visual voice and t-shirt designs. Next, the children will be applying their technical brush skills to create stunning watercolour portraits of endangered animals, raising awareness for those who don't have a voice of their own.

The biggest news of our newsletter is that Year 6 have finished their SATs. The Year 6 team, SLT and whole school are incredibly proud of all the children. They have shown determination and resilience throughout the week. Many coming in feeling unwell...but they got through it.

Whatever the outcome of the SATs, you and they should be extremely proud of how much progress they have made over the year.
